Q2: Had you been previously diagnosed with a different stage of breast cancer?






Q3: How old were you at the time of your MBC diagnosis?



Q6: Do you currently feel that MBC is included in pink ribbon breast cancer initiatives?






Q7: Would you prefer the MBC community have its own awareness initiative?

Q10: If you were to give a speech, what current perception about MBC would you hope to change?













Q11: Would the speech be different if you were talking to MBC patients vs. early stage breast cancer patients?








Q12: Would the speech be different if given to the general public?
