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

Goals of the BCBM Marina Kaplan Project

Ensure an inclusive clinical trial design with less restrictive eligibility criteria

Increase the quality of basic science research

Increase the number of clinical trials testing a variety of interventions

BCBM Subcommittee - Methods

Engagement

- Meet monthly with translational investigators for discussion and provide a patient perspective at least once per month
- Meet with clinical trial PIs and sponsors to ensure that trials ask questions that are important to patients, include both stable and active brain mets, include diverse populations, include PRO's and are designed to maximize benefits and minimize harms
- Quarterly update meetings with Alliance pharma representatives to encourage funding research that will benefit ALL patients with CNS metastasis


Awareness

Find a trial that is right for you

This patient-friendly trial search will make it easy for you to find a clinical trial and understand what researchers are studying, why, and who can take part. This search engine was developed in partnership with Metastatic Trial Search and is based on the National Institute of Health's registry of over a quarter of a million clinical trials. In order to filter these trial MBCBrainMetsog

which you may not qualify, you will need to answer a few simple questions about your breast cancer. If you answers, you can still browse trials that might be right for you.

Clinical trials often exclude patients with <u>CNS</u> metastasis. But the status quo is changing, and more often that accommodate patients with CNS disease at different points in their treatment.

The trial search works best on a Desktop computer. We have a brief tutorial to help optimize your search

- > BCBM Marina Kaplan Project
 - Continued participation in external conferences to raise awareness
- MBCBrainMets.org
 - Continue to add new content, graphics and enhanced functionality/site navigation, new patient stories representing all patient populations
 - Develop new research articles and webinars, interviews with experts
 - Highlighting individual trials on website
- > Future Collaboration with the ABTA
 - Assist in the development/fielding of 2024 surveys (patient, CG, HCP, Researcher), including specific questions for primary cancers



MBC Alliance Patient Voice on Unmet Needs

- Being fully included in trials- not just those with stable brain mets but progressing brain mets as well
- A greater focus on brain mets and leptomeningeal disease in trials and drug development
- Further developing imaging tools and means to identify tumor necrosis vs tumor progression
- Sharing of best practices pan-cancer
- Increased screening for brain mets in the breast cancer community
